It is a call for inclusion; to eliminate barriers so persons with disabilities can live, work, learn, shop, and socialize where they choose; and

Come and Celebrate - Learn - Share!




Join LEAP as we celebrate Disability Pride at this free, public event!

This even aims to be fully inclusive, with ASL interpretation and captioning, a wheelchair charging station, accessible restrooms and a universal changing table, a sensory friendly hour and free face masks. Advocating for Accessible Public Spaces!

Thank you to Ohio City Incorporated for hosting a walk through the neighborhood to assess accessibility through the public spaces.

Here are a few "ways you can be a good neighbor and maintain the sidewalks so everyone can move freely through the neighborhood:

- > Trim low hanging or overgrown branches or landscaping to insure a clear path
- > Keep sidewalks clear of debris
- > Repair sidewalks and curb cuts and if there is a delay in having it fixed, paint or chalk the area to insure visibility
- > Power wash or sweep sidewalks to remove small gravel and debris"
